# Welcome to the Isaac's House Family...

## Safina and Yasin



During a visit to the orphanage in July 2013 the founder of Isaac's House Paul Howells and trustee Beth Hogg were approached by a lovely, quietly spoken lady who requested our help. She is called Elizabeth, aged 30 and originates from Democratic Republic of the Congo. She speaks very little English so with the help of our Housemother Sarah she told us her story. Her Ugandan husband died in 2003 from HIV/Aids and she was left to raise two children Safina 13 and Yasin 9, (pictured in the photographs above). They lived in Kampala, working in the markets before getting chased out by the government. In 2012 they moved to a village close to our orphanage. Elizabeth said she is struggling to pay for rent and food and told us she has also contracted HIV making it difficult for her to work. She is relying on a man she met in Kampala to support her but she told us he has a problem with drinking too much. Both children have attended school this year but Elizabeth has not been able to pay the school fees and the children are at risk of getting thrown out. Elizabeth is very worried about the future for Safina and Yasin as her condition deteriorates. Isaac's House is looking for sponsors to support Safina and Yasin to get the life they deserve and to ease the worry for Elizabeth that her children will always be looked after.

## Gift and Ramson



Isaac's House charity founder Paul Howells met a lovely young man called Ronald who lost his leg due to cancer in 2012. Ronald found life very difficult. The charity decided to fundraise, and help Ronald with his wish to have an artificial leg. When Paul returned to Uganda, Ronald thanked Paul and the charity for transforming his life in so many ways, he was so thankful and appreciative and Paul was really happy to see Ronald enjoying his life again. Sadly, Ronald died a few months ago, his cancer returned. Ronald left behind his loving family, his fiancée Susan, and their two young children Gift and Ramson as shown in the 2nd photograph. Ronald requested for the charity to help support his family once he had gone, and this is what Isaac's House will do. Since Ronald passed away, Susan has been struggling, she has a job but has to spend her wages on childcare which leaves her with little or no money to pay the rent and feed her children. Susan is a lovely lady, with brilliant English and a loving, caring, nature so Isaac's House decided she would be perfect for our new housemother position!! So, in September, Susan, Gift and Ramson, the family together will be moving to James Dunn House of Hope. We are now seeking sponsorship for Gift and Ramson. Kaddu's family have experienced many losses and Kaddu uses his wages to help support his mother, who now raises 6 young children alone, as pictured to the right. Many children have to fetch water, collect firewood, mop the floors, hand wash all their clothes, and many other chores. The children at James Dunn House of Hope orphanage are really lucky to have running water at home, so Mike didn't have to walk too far balancing the water, but he's doing a good job!

Neighbours not fortunate enough to have water at home, send their children to fetch water from the nearby stream, about 10 minutes walk away. They use the water for cooking, bathing, washing their clothes, cleaning their kitchen utensils, mopping the floors and drinking.
